WHY CUBSCOUTING?

Cub Scouting's strength is that it is a well-rounded program positively affecting every area of a boy's life. Cub Scouting encourages boys to achieve a deeper appreciation of others, including peers, parents and other adults. Early in their Scouting experience, boys learn the value of serving others. Cub Scouting provides boys with a sense that they are important as individuals. They learn that their scouting family cares about what happens to them. Cub Scouting promotes activities that lead us to personal responsibility and high self esteem. As a result, when hard decisions have to be made, a boy can look at himself in the mirror and be proud.

Cub Scouting Opportunities

Cub Camps

Your son can experience a variety of outdoor fun during Cub Scout summer Camps. Cub Scouts enjoy special activities geared toward their age groups. During camp, boys will be challenged with archery, field sports, fishing, swimming, leatherwork, crafts and more. Special attractions are also provided.

Pinewood Derby

Boys design and build small wooden cars to race on an inclined track. This is a great opportunity for boys to work with their parents or other adults in the pack to construct a racer and compete in the race.



What is the cost of CubScouting?

Boys and their parents are responsible for purchasing a Cub Scout uniform and a \$50 fee which registers the boy with the national Boy Scouts of American and includes a subscription to "Boy's Life" magazine, and covers the cost of the boy's scout book and awards. Additional expenses are covered by the Pack's fund-raising projects such as popcorn sales. These projects can fund the pack's activities for the entire year. Financial assistance is available for families and for packs. Cub Scouting also funded through voluntary Friends of Scouting.

What's expected of me as a Parent?

Cub Scouting is a program that parents and sons can do together. Parents who volunteer spend an average of two to four hours per week involved in Cub Scouting Activities. This includes meetings with the boys and planning time. As a parent volunteer, there are a variety of positions to fill, such as unit leaders, pack committee chairmen, committee members, den leaders, and chartered organizations representatives.
